## Title - Paper Sculpture. Art Elements - Line/Shape/Form/Space/Colour

### Materials.

You will need a base to glue your pieces on. You could use cardstock or cut up a biscuit/cereal box.

Coloured construction paper strips. (thicker papers hold shape better)

You could use coloured printing paper/wrapping paper/add your own colour decorations to white paper.

Glue stick/PVA/scissors/textas

### Instructions.

### You will turn flat 2D strips of paper into 3D forms.

Cut colourful strips of construction paper and change their shape.

Make 'feet' (fold tabs) on the ends of your shapes, so you can glue them on to your base.

Try to make all your strips look different.

If using PVA, use a small amount to get the best result.





## Some shapes to try.

Zig-zags – fold forwards and backwards.

Curls – hold strip on a pencil and wind it around and around, then slide out the pencil.

Arches – fold 'feet' (tabs) on each end of the strip and glue each end. Glue the feet far apart to make a wide arch & closer together to make a taller thin arch.

Fringes – start with a wide strip & cut fringes into it.

Cylinders – start with a wide strip, roll it & glue the ends together. Cut slits around the bottom and fold them all out so you can glue it on to the base.

## Can you make up some different combinations?

For example, can you make a double ended curl? Can you make zig zag fold fringes? Get creative and invent some more.

Make them go over & under. Can you attach some on top of others?

Fill your base with lots and lots of colourful 3D shapes.

# **Term 3 Remote Learning Activity 3**

## **CARROTS**

# **Prep – Grade 6 SCIENCE**

This activity will last a couple of weeks (You can just do activity 1 part a or extend the activity by doing activity 1 part b and 3 and 4)

- 1. Grow a new carrot from a carrot top
- 2. Grow other plant tops (beetroot, parsnip, swede, turnip)
- 3. Plant some seeds (radish, carrot, parsnip, swede, turnips)

Take photos or draw pictures of what you did.

Write about your chosen activity.

Design your own carrot activity.

### ACTIVITY 1 part a: Grow a new carrot from a carrot top

**Equipment needed:** Knife, plate or saucer, paper towel, carrot tops **Instructions:** 

Cut the top off some carrots.

Put paper towel on the plate or saucer.

Wet the paper towel.

Put the carrot tops on the paper towel.



Once a week take a photo of the carrot tops. When your carrot tops are about 5 cm high plant in the garden by following the instructions in part b.

EXTRA: Do activity 2 at the same time

# ACTIVITY 1 part b: Grow a new carrot (In a few weeks time)

**Equipment:** carrot tops with leaves growing (from actity 1), veggie patch or pot of soil.

#### Instructions:

Plant your carrot tops that have started to grow (the leaves should be about 5 cm tall) from activity one in the garden or in a pot.

## Will a new carrot grow?

Watch your carrot tops to see if they will grow a new carrot. (This will take a few months) Look after your plants by watering regularly.

## **ACTIVITY 2: Grow other plant tops.**

**Equipment**: Knife, plate or saucer, paper towel, plant tops (beetroot, parsnip, swede, turnip)

#### Instructions:

Follow the same instructions as activity 1 part a, but with the different plants.

Did one plant type do better than the other?

Do Activity 1 part b with your different plant tops. Did a new plant grow?

## ACTIVITY 3: Plant some root vegetables from seed.

**Equipment:** plant seeds of your choice, an area in a veggie patch or a pot of soil.

#### Instructions:

Plant the seeds following the instructions on the packet.

Look after your patch, watering it regularly. Keep the weeds away.

How long did it take before you could harvest your crop?
