The school has improved in all measurable areas and must continue to strive for excellence rather than mediocre. The staff is on board for change and embraces the positive direction the school is taking. The school community is also positive and there are regular comments on the raised profile of the school in the community. Teaching and learning must remain our focus as the school continues to develop the efficacy of the classroom teachers.
Considerations for 2019	Intensive speech therapy will continue to be provided in 2018, targeting the children in the Prep - 2 area of the school. Funding has been made available for a student which will make the continued provision of ES staff affordable. Additional support will be allocated to a child enrolling in the prep grade in 2018. Joint teacher planning will be enhanced through format of having two P - 1 classes and two 4 - 5 classes. Professional learning opportunities will be made available to staff as a result of the new agreement.
