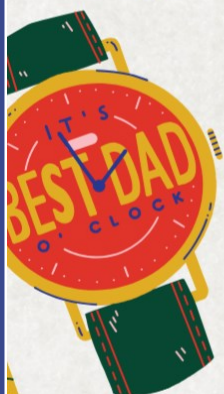

# LIGHTNING PREMIERSHIP

## Football Report

This year, we entered two teams into the AFL 9s competition. The format of the game was similar to our usual rules; however, there were only nine players on the field at a time. We had exactly 18 students for the two teams, and each student was able to play three full games on the day. Each game consisted of two 10-minute halves.

Our Division 2 team played against Yarrawonga P-12, Katunga Primary, and Sacred Heart Yarrawonga. Although we unfortunately lost all three games, the match against Katunga was very close. This was a strong effort, as our team was mostly made up of Grade 4 students. Tex and Fletcher were the main goal scorers for the day. Afterward, we were able to watch the end of a Division 1 match and the Grand Final.

In Division 1, our first game was against Sacred Heart Yarrawonga. They kicked four quick goals in the first five minutes, but after that we outscored them for the remainder of the game. We went down 34-20. Best on ground went to Will, Ethan, and Nixon.

Our next match was against Cobram Primary School, and it was close from start to finish. The lead changed three times, but in the last minute Cobram kicked a goal to take the win. We lost 39-33. Best on ground went to Miller, Oscar, and Blake.

Our final game was against St Joey's Numurkah, which was a fun way to finish the day. We won 43-17. Best on ground went to Riley and Ryan, and Jack scored a goal to ensure all of our Grade 6 students kicked at least one goal on the day.

Everyone had a fantastic day, and we were also able to cheer on the Grade 6 netball team in their final game before heading back on the bus.

The Grade 6 girls played five competitive games, finishing with two wins, two losses, and a thrilling draw in their final match. Throughout the day they worked hard in defence, passed the ball with confidence, and demonstrated excellent teamwork. 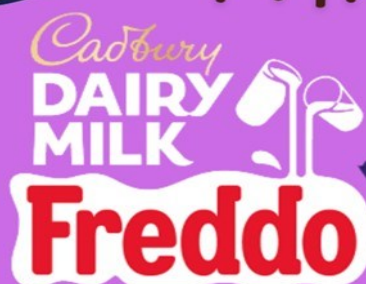

situations

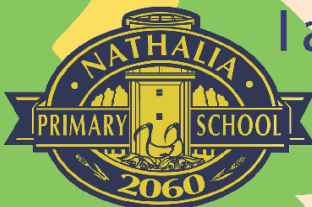
I am willing to stand up for friends and classmates
